A moment with Sebastien

Sebastien de Place is the Founder and Director of We Fly Africa. He took some time to respond the most frequently question asked: why would you need an Air Charter broker?

"Can you tell us, in 3 words, the advantages of working with a broker company?

Definitively the price, safety, and convenience!



Can we go more into detail? Could you take us through the differences between booking a plane directly with an operator and booking through a broker?

I would say that not everyone knows operators in every country where they need an aircraft. In addition, there are 5 points that for me are the main advantages of working with a broker, especially for individuals or companies that are not familiar with the charter flights sector and aircraft renting.

Find the best plane

The choice of your aircraft is very important. It has to match your needs and expectations to save you money, flying time and avoid any disappointment on the size of your seat... fortunately for our budgets, not all charter planes are luxury private jets!

Few criteria have to be considered: safety, number of passengers, weight and size of the luggage, distance to fly, duration of the flights and comfort of the plane.

Should you contact directly an operator, they will first offer you the options they have available (the aircraft they are operating themselves) and may propose a plane that doesn't exactly fit your need i.e. a 6 seater plane although you are 4 passengers with small luggage, which will cost you more than a 4 seater plane.

A broker is not limited to the planes he may be directly operating, but to all the planes available on the market! He works with different operators and will find for you the plane that suits your requirements perfectly. Would you like the most cost-effective solution, the quickest option, or the most luxurious one? These may be 3 different types of planes. Most of the time, the broker will come back to you with different options so that you are able to make the best choice that suits your exact requirements.

Think also about the time you will be saving by not having to look for yourself on the internet for all the operators and their planes.

Check the safety

A broker should not only choose the best fit for his clients but as well the safest options.

At We Fly Africa, we only work with trusted operators, we do check regularly all their safety procedures, the certification of their planes, maintenance certificates, insurance contracts, pilots licenses and flying hours, etc.

Negotiate the best price

A broker is usually of the best operator's clients... as they are significantly booking more flights than a single passenger or company. Most of the time, the Broker's commission is paid by the operator and the final cost for the client is the same as if they had contacted the operator directly.

Personal passengers experience

By working with a broker, you are not only booking an aircraft but a service!

This service includes the passenger's relationship: communication with each of them, answering their questions, issuing their individual tickets, offering a shuttle solution to/from the airfield, and many more.

When working directly with an operator, you are "renting" a plane and a crew but the passenger's relationship is usually yours. A broker can also assist you with admin issues that are usually the passenger's responsibility like traveling visas, permissions to enter or leave a country, or communication with other third parties involved (travel agencies, company, taxi, hotel). Ultimately, a broker will advise you on the best routes, fuels stop options and the airfields to take off and land to reduce your traveling time and budget.

Sell empty seats

Finally, some brokers (like We Fly Africa) will sell on your request the "empty seats" in your plane, especially on the empty legs. Empty legs are the return legs of the plane with no passengers inside: If you book a single trip, the plane has to come back to its original location. If you book a return trip with more than 2 days between the 2 flights, the plane won't stay and has to do 2 trips, which will include 2 "empty legs". When you book a plane through an operator, your cost will be the same whatever the plane is full or empty on each of the legs. These may be very costly for the passengers."

The Blyde River Canyon vs the Grand Canyon

At almost 446km long and 29km at its widest point, the Grand Canyon is the world's largest.
